I have read about beavers in books. It would be exciting to see one.


I hoped the beaver would come. So I sat behind a big bush to wait. The beaver wouldn't be able to see me there. I decided to lie down **upon** the ground to wait.

"What are you?" I asked.


"I am a beaver," he answered. "My name is Roy."

"What work do you do?" I asked.



"Let's pack mud between the logs so the water won't leak out."


The wood duck and the ofter swam to the logs and slapped on mud from the edge of the brook.
