One-time scholarships of **\$3,000** are awarded. Scholarships are paid in two installments upon receipt of the student's proof of enrollment in the institution of secondary education.

Accomplishments of previous scholarship recipients include:

- Founded a GSA or diversity club and/or provided leadership in the organization at their school
- Organized Day of Silence activities
- Organized support to include gender orientation in local civil rights ordinances and/or school district non-discrimination policies
- Discussed issues facing LGBTQ+ youth with school administration, faculty, and/or community groups
- Wrote articles in community and school papers addressing LGBTQ+ issues
- Addressed LGBTQ+ issues in school debates, speeches, and forums
- Actively affirmed and advocated for LGBTQ+ students in their school
- Provided positive image and role model as an out and open LGBTQ+ student/ally

Academic achievement and extra-curricular activities are also considered.
